SPECIAL LIQUOR COMMISSION MINUTES THURSDAY, NOVEMBER 20, 2008 3:00 P.M. CITY HALL COUNCIL CHAMBERS

Deputy Liquor Commissioner Rick Von Rohr called the meeting to order at 3:10 p.m.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Deputy Liquor Commissioner Rick Von Rohr led the members in the pledge.

ROLL CALL

The following members were present for roll call: Fire Chief Chuck Lauss, Police Chief Tim Gillespie, and Deputy Liquor Commissioner Rick Von Rohr. Also present: Sue Bosich, Assistant Corporation Counsel, and Sue McMillan, City Clerk. Absent: Liquor Commissioner David Tebben, Holly Brown, and David Eitenmiller.

APPROVAL OF AGENDA

Motion made by Lauss, seconded by Gillespie to approve the agenda as presented. On roll call vote all present voted Aye. Motion carried.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Motion made by Gillespie, seconded by Lauss to approve the minutes of November 3, 2008 as presented. On roll call vote, all present voted Aye. Motion carried.

PUBLIC INPUT/COMMENTS/QUESTIONS

There were no comments or questions received.

NEW BUSINESS

Pizza Hut of America, Inc. dba Pizza Hut

Commission Members reviewed the application of a new corporation continuing the restaurant business in the same premises on Court Street. The corporate office had submitted the application. No representative of the business was present and McMillan was asked to contact the local manager Karen Zimmerman to inquire if they were aware of the meeting and would be attending. Members expressed concern regarding documentation issues. Officer Von Rohr contacted Investigation to confirm local manager/listed agent had submitted payment and background information for criminal history check.

Members requested the following before a recommendation or action would take place:

- New, complete with agent, original application. Not faxed, no attached e-mail changes, correct type of liquor license applied for, no whiteouts or strikethroughs.
- Corrected cover letter of submission that the company intends to locate in Pekin not Morton

It was noted the establishment had discontinued selling alcohol until a current license was issued. The Commission set a special meeting for Monday, December 8 @ 3:00 p.m. also as a rescheduled regular meeting for December due to the holidays and vacations.

Any Other Business to Come Before the Commission:

Eitenmiller entered the meeting 3:35 p.m. He expressed concern that a licensee, Yesterday's Bar & Grill, was serving alcohol in apartments on the second level of the premises. Deputy Liquor Commissioner Von Rohr confirmed that he had investigated and there was no violation of the City Code.

Motion was made by Gillespie, seconded by Lauss to adjourn.

**CITY OF PEKIN TRAFFIC SAFETY COMMITTEE MINUTES
DECEMBER 5, 2008
CITY HALL CONFERENCE ROOM**

PRESENT: Joe Wuellner, Denny Kief, Dave Pagliaro, Chuck Lauss, Greg Nelson, Will Taylor. Also present, Lee Ann Wrhel.

Old Business:

1. *Restricted Parking*

An area of town to review will be discussed at the next meeting.

2. *Downtown Parking*

Joe Wuellner presented a drawing of diagonal parking on the north side of Court Street from Capitol Street to 4th Street. Using a 30 degree angle, parking would increase from 17 spaces to 32 spaces, with an increase of one handicapped slot. It creates no potential problems for the Fire Department or snow removal. If the change is made, the area would need to be temporarily blocked off for striping purposes. Denny Kief presented a motion to forward a drawing to Leigh Ann Matthews for presentation to Pekin Main Street with a recommendation from the Traffic Safety Committee that the change would be on the north side only from 3rd Street to 6th Street with parking on the south side to remain as is. The motion was seconded by Greg Nelson, all in favor.

Joe Wuellner will have a map drawn up reflecting the recommendation and forward it to Leigh Ann Matthews.

New Business:

1. *Parking 1000 Block Washington St. - Discussion*

John Neumann has purchased a piece of property on Washington Street for a parking lot. The Traffic Safety Committee will revisit the street parking situation in this area after the parking lot is in use.

2. *Lighting 1300 Block Park Avenue - Discussion*

The hospital has made a request for a street light in the middle of the 1300 block of Park Avenue near the crosswalk. Dave Pagliaro presented a motion to contact AmerenCILCO about installing a street light through the franchise agreement. The motion was seconded by Denny Kief, all in favor.

3. *Parking - 402 S. 7th Street - Alley Request*

Dave Pagliaro reported that Travis Regan made a request to have the parking restriction eliminated in front of his house. He also requested to have the alley next to his house be one-way headed east. The restriction had been put in place at the request of the residents in the neighborhood. Joe Wuellner reported that St. Joseph Catholic Church will be installing a new parking lot. The parking in this area will remain as is at this time. When the parking lot is in use, this request could be reviewed to determine if the new parking lot relieves the traffic concern in this area. A blind drive sign will be installed in the alley, but the alley will remain 2-way.

Around the Table

Joe Wuellner reported that there has been a Handicapped Parking space request by St. Paul's Episcopal Church, 411 Washington Street. Denny Kief presented a motion to make a recommendation to City Council for installation of a Handicapped Parking space on the west side of Buena Vista 96 feet north of Washington Street. The motion was seconded by Chuck Lauss, all in favor. Joe Wuellner and Dave Pagliaro will re-evaluate the placement of the space because of a possible walkway obstruction.

Greg Nelson presented a concern regarding motorists coming out of East Court Village onto Court Street. There are motorists turning left from the right (outside) lane. Joe Wuellner will check the area to determine what type of signage and signage placement options are available in that area.

I hereby submit to you the Pekin Fire Department November 2008 report, plus a summary of October 2008.

During the month of November 2008, the Pekin Fire Department responded to 332 calls, total dollar loss was \$10,150.00.

During the month of November 2008 (approximately 74.39%) were emergency medical call, 85 were automatic fire alarms, service calls, small hazardous conditions involving no fire, false alarms.

During the month of October 2008, the Pekin Fire Department responded to 292 calls, total dollar loss was \$157,600.00.

During the month of October 2008 (approximately 65.06%) were emergency medical calls, 102 were automatic fire alarms, service calls, small hazardous conditions involving no fire, false alarms.

On November 15, 2008 Fire Fighters responded to an oven fire at 1214 S. 3rd Street. Upon arrival, E3 assumed command and reported that there was nothing showing at this time. Upon entering the residence, crews from E3 and T3 found fire on the stovetop to be out. Tenant stated she turned her stovetop on and flames shot up from burner. She had no cooking objects on the stove at the time. Tenant then threw flour on the stovetop to extinguish the flames. When she threw the flour the flames increased to the under side of the upper cabinet. The fire was then cooled and extinguished with a pressurized water extinguisher, by fire personnel. The fire had spread to the lower countertop and base cabinet corner causing damage. The oven gas was shut off and the oven was removed to the outdoors. A PPV fan was set up at the front door to

evacuate the smoke from the structure. The home was furnished with three smoke detectors, but none were operating due to the lack of batteries. Cilco was called and advised that the gas to the home was shut off due to possible gas leak at the oven fitting. The tenants were able to stay two doors down with family if need be, but batteries were to be installed in detectors by landlord within 30 minutes, and Cilco was enroute. The tenant was informed in the future not to try to extinguish fire with flour, but instead use a fire extinguisher. Total dollar loss was approximately \$2,000.00.

On November 23, 2008 Fire Fighters responded to a car fire at 12 White Pine with person inside and car in middle of corn field. Upon arrival found driver outside of vehicle who was then transported to PMH with no injuries. We extinguished car fire as well as corn stalks that were on fire. Total dollar loss was approximately \$1,550.00.

On November 26, 2008 Fire Fighters for an outside burn at 1304 S. 6th. Street. Upon arrival found a 55 gallon barrel burning next to an unattached garage. The barrel was burning and fire was spreading up the garage wall. The fire was extinguished and the garage was searched for fire spread. The garage was filled with hazardous containers; the fire did not spread to the inside of the garage. The fire was contained to the outside wall. Total dollar loss was approximately \$1,000.00.

On November 29, 2008 Fire Fighters responded to a possible structure fire at 1301 Koch Street. Upon arrival F3 took command and reported light smoke in the bathroom where the exhaust fan had burned up. The residents had put out the fire with an extinguisher. We pulled down the ceiling and checked for extinctions, we wet down the area and shut off the breaker box. F3 had TAZCOM call for the electrical inspector, he did not answer so let a message to go and check out the house so they can get the rest of the power turned back on. F3 told the home owners that if the inspector shows up they can probably spend the night. But if he does not make it that they would have to stay some where else. We used the fan to clear out the smoke and then we cleared. Total dollar loss was approximately \$2,600.00.

With the hiring of fire fighter Pat Rademaker, his captains are busy instructing him on the jobs that he will be performing. Fire streams, master streams, and water supply have been the main training topics so far. We will continue to work with Pat for several months.

Terry Tatum will be graduating from the Peoria Fire Academy on Dec. 9. After the hazmat operations class, he will begin work on his shift. We have had very good reports coming from the instructors from Peoria about Terry.

Dear Mayor Tebben:

We have received and reviewed the proposed contract award documents for the above referenced EDA project and found them acceptable subject to the following conditions:

1. The proposed contract is for the extension of the existing Hanna Drive from the Canadian National Rail Road (CNRR) main line in an easterly direction to 5th Street (the EDA scope of work) and the relocation of an existing rail spur (out of EDA scope of work) in the City of Pekin.
2. It is the responsibility of the Recipient of EDA Award to ensure the legality of action it is taking in awarding the contract, obtaining the approval from appropriate agencies and authorities at the proper time, complying with the requirements of the permits issued and ensuring the availability of all funding beyond the proportionate amount committed by EDA.
3. The EDA concurrence for the referenced construction contract is provided as follows:

4. Concurrence provided herein is based on the information in the above referenced contract award documents and a letter dated December 8, 2008 which certifies compliance with the requirements of 15CFR, Part 24.36 in regards to the contract procurement process, the availability of the committed local share of \$1,174,000 and the availability of \$292,413 to cover the cost of non-EDA eligible construction work described in item #1 above.
5. The cost of the EDA eligible construction work is under the \$ 2,055,000 construction line of the approved budget by \$684,696. These left over funds are available for the construction of the rail road crossing work (EDA eligible) by CNRR.
6. As a recipient of the EDA grant award, the City of Pekin will be responsible for monitoring the payroll of general and all sub-contractors for the compliance with the Davis Bacon Wage Rates requirements.

1. Furnish a copy of signed *agreement* and *Notice-To-Proceed* requiring the contractor to start and finish the project construction in compliance with the current scheduled dates as stated in the Special condition #2 of the EDA Award.
2. Erect an EDA project sign in the project area upon issuing the *Notice-To-Proceed* for the above contract. A photograph showing this sign is required per the Special Condition #10 of the EDA Award.
3. Inform the Office of the Federal Contract Compliance Programs (OFCCP) of the contract awards in accordance with enclosed instructions.

Please note that the disbursement of funds by EDA is contingent upon undertaking construction work for the entire project and when the City of Pekin has provided satisfactory documentation for the compliance with all the special conditions of the EDA Award.

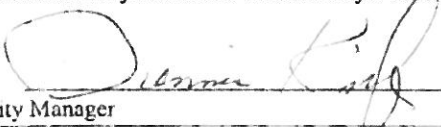

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

APRIL 30, 2008

NOTE 1 - SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

In accordance with generally accepted governmental accounting principles, the Sewerage Fund is a separate accounting fund within the City of Pekin's fund accounting system which is designed to account for and report upon specific activities or certain objectives.

The fund is an Enterprise Fund and, accordingly, employs the accrual basis of accounting wherein revenues are recognized in the period in which they are earned and expenses are recognized in the period in which they are incurred.

Fixed assets used in the operations of the sewerage system are stated at cost where historical records are available and at estimated historical cost where no historical records exist. Depreciation expense is recorded as a charge against income and is computed using the straight-line method based upon the estimated useful lives of the fixed assets, generally 5-40 years.

NOTE 2 - TRANSFER TO GENERAL FUND

The City allocates a portion of its administrative expenses to more accurately reflect costs of sewer operations. City officials have estimated General Fund expenses applicable to the Sewerage Fund to be \$11,925 per month.

NOTE 3 - NET ASSET ADJUSTMENT

In 1990 the City established an allowance for uncollectible accounts based on estimated bad debts at that time.

In 2001 the City contracted its sewer billing services to Illinois-American Water Co. The Water Company uses the direct write-off method for debt debts pursuant to their collection policy. Therefore, the balance of \$64,000 in the allowance for doubtful accounts has been added back to Net Assets as of the beginning of the year.

The proposed Levy set in December of 2008 would establish the City's property tax rate for those taxes received in 2009 when the County determines the final EAV.

The Levied amount (\$5,668,196 proposed) becomes the fixed number. The respective rates are based on the EAV. If the final EAV comes in higher than anticipated, the rate declines. Conversely if the EAV is lower than estimated, the rate increases.

The Police and Fire Pension amounts are established from Actuarial studies conducted on those funds and have been endorsed by those respective Pension Boards. The Library's amount has been requested by the Library Board. The remainder goes in the General Fund (to fund a portion of Police and Fire Operations).

As proposed December 8th on the Council Floor, the Library increased \$48,702 (5%) from last year's Levy
Police Pension based on 103% of Actuarial Calculation = \$275,946 (32.82%) increase from last year's Levy
Fire Pension based on 105% of Actuarial Calculation = \$349,824 (24.01%) increase from last year's Levy
General Fund (Police & Fire Protection) decrease \$369,520 (17.67%) from last year's Levy

Proposed 2008 Levy of \$5,668,196 = +5.69% higher than 2007 Levy

Estimated Rate (based on Estimated EAV) = 1.2645 or -2.91% lower than 2007 Levy rate

The 2008 estimated rate of 1.2645 is 0.79% lower than the 1.2746 that was on last Year's tax bill after the final EAV's came out.

FINANCIAL IMPACT: \$5,668,196 to the City's Revenue stream

NEIGHBORHOOD CONCERNS: What does this mean to the average homeowner?

Lets assume that when this years tax bills come out that the EAV is exactly what we estimate.

Lets assume that the EAV of the average \$150,000 home increased by 4% from last year.

2007 = \$50,000 @ 1.2746 = \$637.30 (City Portion of 2007 Tax Bill)

2008 = \$52,000 @ 1.2645 = \$657.54 (Estimated City Portion of 2008 Tax Bill)

IMPACT IF APPROVED: Levy would be set and final tax rate would be based on City's EAV at the time when the County sends out the property tax bills.

IMPACT IF DENIED: City's FY 2009 budget would start with a \$5,668,196 deficit unless a different amount were set.

ALTERNATIVES: Other revenue sources such as increase in locally controlled taxes or user fees or enactment of new tax or user fee

IMPACT IF APPROVED: Parking & traffic congestion will be reduced.

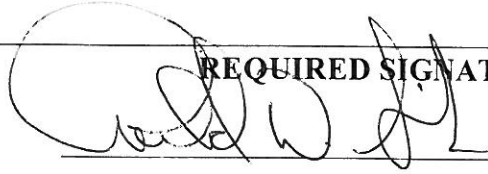

**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING TITLE 8, CHAPTER 4, SECTION 3 F.
OF THE CODE OF THE CITY OF PEKIN 1995
REGARDING HANDICAPPED SPACES**

WHEREAS, it is in the best interests of the safety and welfare of the residents of the City of Pekin, Tazewell County, Illinois that a handicapped space be placed on Buena Vista Street north of Washington Street. This will allow for parking at St. Paul's Episcopal Church; and

WHEREAS, per recommendation of the Traffic Safety Committee at the meeting of December 5, 2008, the City Council has determined that it is in the best interests of the City to amend the Traffic Code regarding authorized handicapped signs.

1. That Title 8, Chapter 4, Section 3. F. be amended by adding the following designated Handicapped Space:

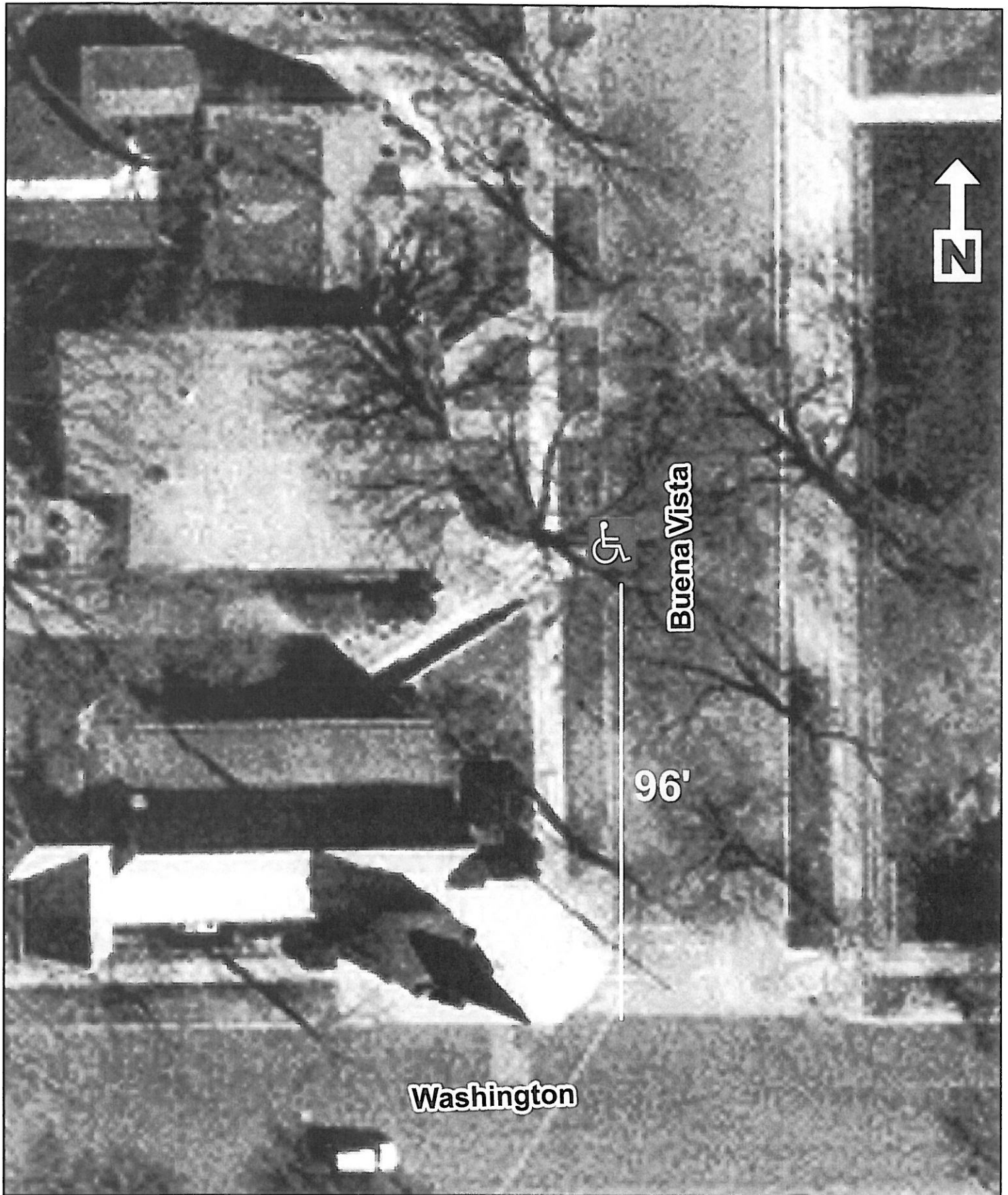
