



**PUBLIC INFRASTRUCTURE IMPROVEMENTS COMMITTEE MINUTES

CALL TO ORDER

Council Member Lloyd Orrick called the meeting to order at 1:30 p.m.

PLEDGE

The Pledge of Allegiance was led by Mike Guerra. .

ROLL CALL

Present: Council Member Lloyd Orrick and Council Member Michael Garrison were present for roll call. Council Member John Abel was absent.

ALSO PRESENT: City Engineer Michael Guerra, Project Engineer Josie Esker, City Manager Mark Rothert, Finance Director Bruce Marston, Street Superintendent Bob Shaw and City Clerk Sue McMillan.

APPROVAL OF AGENDA

Motion made by Committee Member Garrison to approve the December 17, 2018 Agenda, seconded by Committee Member Orrick. All in favor.

PUBLIC INPUT/COMMENTS/QUESTIONS

Chairman Orrick asked that questions from those attending be held until the end of the meeting.

NEW BUSINESS

Review and recommendation for repairs in Deerfield Estates.

Parkfield Drainage Improvements plat was distributed. Mike and Josie presented the cause of the stormwater problem at Parkfield and Hanna Drive in the Deerfield Estates Subdivision. Members were told there was no overflow structure or path built into the detention pond at 1839 Meadow. The area that was planned to be used for detention was filled in at 1835 and 1831 Meadow. Water then overflows at 1824 and 1828 Parkfield. A solution was suggested to add an overflow structure in the detention pond at 1839 Meadow Lane.

Estimated cost:

Outside contractor \$15,000

Material cost using street department \$3,000

Schedule February – March 2019

Mike felt there was enough money in the Infrastructure Committee Funds remaining unobligated to include in the City performed projects.

Review and recommendation for terms for proposed agreement with Hornecker Construction for El Camino Drive Drainage

Members were next informed of a second project for storm sewer improvements on ElCamino Drive. Cause of problem: no definable ditch to pond backing water to the street. Solution: extend 15" diameter pipe from the road inlet to the pond. The location was currently being developed and the developer was willing to install the storm pipe if the City purchased the pipe. Mr. Hornecker granted the City the easement along the property for the pipe installation. Cost of material \$3,000.

Council approved \$38,000 for stormwater repairs of named projects. With a majority completed under budget Mike recommended that Resolution 110 be modified to include \$6,000.00. (Clerk's note: January 14, 2019) Motion by Council Member Orrick, seconded by Council Member Garrison to approve both projects.

Review of additional locations of storm water issues as a result of December 1st Storm.

Exhibit C was next distributed. The following locations were identified, problem presented and initial assessment discussed.

Hawthorne

Brentwood Ditch at Lake Kennedy

Willow Creed Tributary near Florence

CMP – Pipe Failures

18th Street West Shore Culvert contract awarded to Otto Baum 1/31/19

Thrush creek erosion contract awarded to Keppler Environmental 1/31/19

2101 Windsor waiting meeting with attorney to discuss proceeding for condemnation to procure necessary easement. Ironwood/Pine Creek erosion contract awarded to Stark Excavating 2/15/19

PUBLIC INPUT/COMMENTS/QUESTIONS

Vista Grande

Jim Mangan asked that the committee work toward getting the problem solved for the Vista Grande residents. Mr. Mangan asked questions about a detention pond for Ironwood that did not drain and the ditch behind Pine Street. He had questions or comments on Koch Street, 18th Street, Lake Arlan, LADD.

Dave Nutter commented on the use of the Street Department and rental equipment/purchase of equipment.

Glen Johnson submitted a letter to the City with his concerns for the amount of stormwater runoff and area of watershed that dumps into Lake Kennedy. He asked for a solution to the debris, chemical pollutants, tires and excessive sedimentation.
